



## Masonry in California

Masonry has been an integral part of California for more than 150 years. During the Gold Rush of 1849, thousands of settlers came to California in search of fortune. Many of these men were Masons and brought with them Masonic values and traditions. Not surprisingly, some of California's first Masonic lodges were established in the mining towns of the Gold Country. In 1850 - the same year that California became a state - the Grand Lodge of California was established in Sacramento.

Within 10 years, the number of Masonic lodges in the new state had grown from 11 to 130, while membership soared from 258 to more than 5,000. Over the years, the Masons have played a key role in shaping the history of California. To date, 19 California governors have been Masons, and at least four California Masons have been elected to the U.S. Senate. Today there are more than 60,000 members and about 340 lodges, making the Grand Lodge of California one of the largest in the world.



## From Operative to Speculative

Freemasons today use the terms 'operative' and 'speculative' to describe themselves and their ancient brethren. Operative Masons preceded the 1700's and describes those Masons who actually worked with stone, chisels and hammers performing amazing task as they carved huge stones weighing thousands of pounds from rock quarries, transported them, shaped them, and raised them high into the air to build marvelous cathedrals and monuments. They did all of this by understanding the art of Geometry and how its proper use could enabled them to perform what appeared as miracles to the common man. Guilds were developed by these craftsman, to hold members to high standards and pass down their craft to newer generations. Secret modes of recognition easily identified a traveling brother of the guild. These craftsman were in high demand.

By the 1500's, the Renaissance introduced the rebirth of science, art and learning. With the invention of the printing press information and knowledge could be passed around the world in a very short period of time. Commoners became better educated and the Masonic Guilds lost their monopoly on building contracts.

By the 1600's Gothic architecture had lost its popularity, and brick, not stone became the building material of choice. In essence, Operative Masons were no longer viable. During the 1640's, English lodges began to admit non-workers of stone, known as 'admitted' or 'accepted' masons. During the Age of Reason, after 1651, scientific theories opened men's minds to the possibility that life was more than just religion, magic and superstition. Faith was still important, but scientist acknowledged that the bible did not have all the answers to life. Some of these scientist became part of the Royal Society of London, consisting also of, philosophers and scholars. It was a think tank of the best and brightest minds and many were Masons. During the 1660's these new speculative masons saw ideal symbolism between the Operative and Speculative crafts. A building constructed of a strong, well balanced structure, constructed by likeminded men, and dedicated to God, easily equated to building character in men. Thus modern Freemasonry obtained its roots.
