



MASONIC HOMES AT UNION CITY

Located 40 miles east of San Francisco, atop 267 acres of scenic property, the Masonic Home at Union City officer panoramic views and a moderate climate.

Its gated ground are home to about 300 residents who live in comfortable studio or one bedroom apartments. The campus offers independent living, assisted living, skilled nursing, memory care, and onsite post-surgical rehabilitation. Residents enjoy multiple health and wellness center, walking trails, activity areas, comfortable indoor and outdoor areas for small or large groups, a lodge room and a worship center.

In the sunny San Gabriel Valley, just 30 miles east of downtown Los Angeles, the Masonic Home at Covina sits on 33 acres of a retired citrus ranch. Its scenic setting features wide expanses of lawn dotted with large native trees, characteristic of the beauty of Southern California.

Our campus is home to about 80 residents who live in comfortable one-bedroom apartments designed for independent and assisted living. Residents choose the Masonic Home at Covina for its intimate setting, vibrant quality of life, and perhaps most of all, the sense of community created by fellow residents and staff.

CARE SERVICES

Independent Living: Comfortable apartment-style residences provide modern amenities for residents who live independently.

In-home Care: Friendly, professional caregivers are available to help residents who require some in-home assistance with daily activities, such as bathing, medication management, dressing, personal care, or mobility.

Skilled Nursing: For residents, who require greater support, 5-star rated skilled nursing and rehabilitation services are available on campus in Union City and through trusted community partners in Covina.

Memory Care: The Union City campus offers specifically qualified staff, comfortable accommodations, and focused, dignified care for residents experiencing dementia or Alzheimer's disease.

Hospice: Caring, professional staff and clergy are available to support residents and their families with end-of-life care and arrangements.

WAIT TIMES

Depending upon the level of accommodation needed, historically wait times could be up to 24 months. Recent developments however have helped cut these times and in some cases, wait times are between 3 to 6 months.

VISIT AND TOUR THE HOMES

Tours can be arranged to visit the Homes. In 2017, my Wife and I visited the Home in Union City. It's was just beautiful. We met and talked with the residents and were able to tour the facility. The Lodge (and the outdoor Lodge also) would be enough for most Masons, but the facilities, accommodations, and the activities that are available are extraordinary. Residents glowed and spoke highly of the staff. If you're like the rest of us, we all worry about the abuse the can take place in a 'retirement home'. This is different, much different from any home that I've ever had to visit for a friend or loved one. I can truly recommend this as an option if at some point you feel a need to actually retire. Payment options vary, but the one thing most everyone told us during the visit is that "They should have moved in earlier".

Eligibility for the Homes

- 1. Must be 60 years or older.
- **2.** A California Master Mason in Good Standing for 5 consecutive years.
- **3.** The wife or widow of an eligible Master Mason.
- **4.** The Mother of an eligible Master Mason.

Payment Options

- 1: Partial Assignment (75%) of Assets and Income. No fees are required. Residents are provided all care and services, including health and dental, at no additional cost.
- **2.** Entrance Fee + Lower Monthly Fee. With this option residents are responsible for their own medical and dental expenses.
- **3. Monthly Fee Only.** Higher monthly fee and residents are responsible for their own medical and dental expenses.

BALLOTING

804.440: BALLOTING PROCEUDRE: (*Paraphrased*)

A. The Master shall read the name of the applicant(s) and their essential information before the ballot.

- B. A Lodge shall have but one ballot for the three degrees.
- C. There shall be no discussion in the Lodge during a ballot.
- D. Every present member in good standing must vote.
- E. The Master should not permit anyone to enter or retire from the Lodge during a ballot except for sickness of other imperative reasons.
- F. When balloting on two or more candidates, it is at the Masters discretion regarding a separate or collective ballot.
- G. A unanimous vote of the members present and in good standing is required to elect an applicant.
- H. If balloting upon a single applicant and only one cube appears, a second ballot shall be ordered to correct a possible mistake, and shall not be postponed to another meeting. If a cube appears in the second ballot, the Master shall declare the applicant rejected.
- I. If balloting upon a single applicant and two or more cubes appear, the Master shall declare the applicant rejected.

804.450. BALLOT SECRECY: Except for the three officers whose duty it is to examine the ballot box, no one is entitled to know the number of votes cast for or against an applicant. There shall be no discussion regarding an unfavorable ballot. No member of the Lodge shall be required, requested, or allowed to divulge his vote upon a ballot, or to assign reasons for such vote, if it be known, except to the Master for the purpose of correcting a mistake. The fore going notwithstanding, such discussion or disclosure is permitted when reporting, preparing, investigating and/or adjudicating charges of alleged unmasonic conduct relating to a ballot.
